You don't know me!

Have you ever had times when someone tried to speak for you, speak about you, or speak into your experience, but they really had no idea what's going on in your life.

I am certain I have done this to others.

It's natural. We want to make a connection with someone, so we try to relate. But everyone's experience is unique and it's difficult to truly know what it's like to walk in someone else's shoes.



And yet, Jesus knows. Because God sent Jesus into this world, He knows what we have experienced. And Jesus continues to know us and wants to speak into our experiences.


Intergenerational Lent Activity




John: Gospel of Light and Life




Discipleship Path

Our projects 2023



We continue with a new semester of our ESL program. The students report that they are very satisfied with the opportunity to improve their English and have progressed in their language skills with having been promoted to a more advanced level.



We are preparing 12 students to celebrate their First Communion. This group meets every Sunday.



We started this month with a community garden project. We already have the necessary funds. As a first step, we will give four talks to impart basic knowledge and begin fieldwork during the spring. We invite you to participate and share your knowledge in this area. We are excited to implement this new program in Kinsmen, led by the Latino community.



"The Academy" is a resource in Spanish provided by the ELCA for the Lutheran formation of our community. We are planning sessions to cover this program throughout the year and develop leaders.



We also want to strengthen Latino leadership by giving greater participation and responsibilities to our volunteers, and attracting added resources to increase active participation in the church.



Finally, we focus on interaction, on becoming an increasingly united group. We started with the flower committee and knitting blankets for our baptisms, two activities where the language is not limiting. We want to demonstrate, with the facts, that there should be no barriers between groups with a common goal to grow in faith and be an instrument of the Lord.

We are open to having all the support, help and knowledge of our congregation to achieve our goals for this year.











What we are working on


This Lent we have created an activity to prepare us for the resurrection of Christ, to strengthen our faith and to draw us closer to the Lord with our actions.

If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and be filled," and yet you do not give them what is necessary for their body, what use is that? James 2:15-16

The book of James reminds us of the important difference between words and actions. We can't just talk about helping our neighbors in need, we must also take action and make it happen.

In prior years, the Kinsmen Endowment Fund has made possible gifts in loving response to community needs related to natural disasters, emergent basic needs assistance, and the COVID-19 pandemic.
