## **Pastor's Word**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy New Year! This past year we have continued to be about God's mission of "Inspiring every generation to experience and share God's grace in Jesus Christ." Here are just a *few* of the many highlights from 2022 by the numbers. Together we:

- Celebrated our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with festive events on February 27 (the date when Kinsmen was formally organized)
- Served over 130 people at the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Crawfish Boil on May 21 (the date of the first charter member Sunday)
- Filled 124 Holiday Bags for children that went to Northwest Assistance Ministries for Christmas



- Made and delivered 514 flower re-arrangements after beautifying our worship services
- Served at 10 projects on God's Work. Our Hands weekend where over 190 individuals were serving in some way.
- Saved 256 lives through blood donations with Gulf Coast Regional Donor Coach being at Kinsmen 4 times in 2022
- Served 846 meals for Thanksgiving Feast and registered 89 to participate in the Run for Your Turkey.
- Enabled Sleep in Heavenly Peace to build and deliver over 2400 beds to children in northwest Harris County over the past 4 years through generous donations and volunteer activities.
- Served 20,882 individuals or 4,971 families with the support of Bridging for Tomorrow and the Houston Food Bank mobile food truck in 2022.
- Trained 5 and sent 37 Community of Hope Lay Chaplains to make over 5,000 visits to homebound members.
- Supported 5 local schools through encouraging emails to teachers, providing breakfasts or other goodies, participating in school events, and supporting Klein ISD Moms with necessities.
- Welcomed 42 New Members into God's mission at Kinsmen/ Sagrada Familia this year.
- Offered 12 Bible, Theology, Stewardship and Evangelism classes and 8 sermon series
- Offered over 226 English and Spanish language worship services in person and livestreaming (on YouTube and Facebook Live).
- Hosted our 18th annual St. Jude Trike-a-thon with KCA's Early Learning program and raised \$1885 this year, for a total of over \$20,000.
- Reached and connected with up to 29 young adults with children through Playground Playdates.
- Provided the opportunity for 40 youth and young adults to grow in discipleship and leadership while passing on the faith from one generation to the next through Camp Hope.
- Engaged 106 campers from preschool to middle school in learning 15 different bible stories for 3 weeks at Camp Hope where they grew in their faith, made new friends, and were mentored by high school staff.
- Confirmed 6 youth at Kinsmen in May and 10 youth and adults at Sagrada Familia in October.
- Baptized 17 children who received God's promises in the waters of baptism






- Taught 70 ESL students through Latino Ministries.
- Completed the repairs and renovations of 11 spaces: the gym, 3 preschool rooms, the loft, the great rooms, the community room, the choir room/ chapel, the coffeehouse, and rooms 12 & 13.
- Collected and distributed Noisy Offering in support of 6 local and 5 global mission partners.

These are only a few of the things we did together in 2022. Thank you for the ways you participate and make a difference with your time, talent and treasures. Together let us serve and live because it matters in our homes, communities, and world! I look forward to following where God is leading Kinsmen/ Sagrada Familia in 2023.


## Flower Angel

Ever sit in church on Sunday and wonder where the flowers on the altar came from? They might have come from the person sitting next to you.

Kinsmen is blessed with its own Flower Committee. The Flower Committee takes donations of \$25 in honor of, in memory of a loved one or in celebration of a family milestone and uses the donations to create the beautiful altar and narthex arrangements. After the worship services the arrangements are moved to the cooler in the flower room. On Mondays, a team of rearrangers break the floral pieces down to make smaller arrangements of flowers that are delivered to Kinsmen members and friends.

If you have donated flowers for that week one of the smaller arrangements will be delivered to you. The smaller arrangements may be delivered to the hospitalized, the homebound, the sick, the grieving, those celebrating the birth of a baby, and/or even for "just because" reasons.

Your \$25 donation for flowers does a lot of work. It beautifies the Sanctuary for the worship services, it can honor a loved one's memory,


## Men's Evening Bible Study



We want to ensure that the people who attend the services and participate in our activities feel is welcomed and that they are willing to do their part to strengthen this congregation.


This will all be possible if we continue to walk the path of faith, love and humility and are guided by the wise hands of God.

### MEET PASTOR ADRIANA JOHNSON-RIVAS!

I was born in a blessed May night in the beautiful city of Medellin, Colombia, where the whole country recognizes it as the city of eternal spring. Medellin is a city that boasts a vivid bouquet of romantic flowers year round, and as my father once explained to me, it is why my cheeks are so colorful. I was born into a large family with 2 handsome bothers and 5 attractive sisters all under the watchful eyes of two hardworking and loving parents. In Colombia I studied to be a teacher, but I never had a chance to master my education and develop a career. It was until 1986 when I decided to follow some of my sisters into the US looking for other opportunities. This is where I met the father of my two strapping sons, Kenneth Alexander and Kelly Dustin Johnson. It was until Prince of Peace I had the opportunity to really practice what I learned in Colombia when I began teaching classes of Catechism to both youngster and adults. Before I accepted the position of SALM, (synodically authorized lay minister) I served as a volunteer at the church of Prince of Peace, teaching the children and adults for approximately 8 years. I had the opportunity to study in the Institute of Evangelism of Prince of Peace "La Escuelita" during its two year

which built a foundation of knowledge to bring to collaborate the Hispanic mission "Light of Christ" in La Porte, Texas, which developed between June 2005 to May 2006. In 2009 due to the health of the former Pastor, I was put in charge of the congregation of Prince of Peace. To properly fill this role, I enrolled with TEEM (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries) in the seminary of LSPS (Lutheran Seminary Program in the Southwest) in Austin, Texas. Now in 2013 I was ordained at Principe de Paz under a big tent on our 6 acres of open field where family, friends, members, and colleagues alike will share with me a grand moment in my life made possible by hard work, brilliant teachers, and above all, a sweet and merciful God.

In the spring of 2014, the president and the council of St. James asked me to help them in the mission Santiago Apostol because the deacon Aura Suarez went to Miami with her husband, and they needed a pastor in the mission. Initially thought to do for a few months but because of the lack of Latino pastors I had to stay for about three years. It was a wonderful experience a great learning time.

When somebody asked at what point or reason I felt the call to work in God's work? My answer is swift. It is through service, and my unconditional desire to help others. "I serve God, live for God and I am glad to be His daughter."




#### Noisy Offering—Living Water International

Everything begins with water.


Water is the foundation of all sustainable development. It impacts every aspect of life: hygiene and sanitation, mental and social well-being, justice issues for women and children, education, the economy, and the environment.

Yet 771 million people lack basic access to water. Communities are trapped in debilitating poverty because they constantly suffer from water-related diseases and parasites, and/or because they spend long stretches of their time carrying water over long distances. In response to this need, we implement participatory, community-based water solutions in developing countries. Since



It all began when a group from Houston, Texas traveled to Kenya and saw the desperate need for clean drinking water. They returned to Houston and founded a 501(c)3 non-profit. The fledgling organization equipped and trained a team of Kenyan drillers and Living Water Kenya began operations the next year under the direction of a national board. That pattern continues today; we train, consult, and equip local people to implement solutions in their own communities in the countries where we work.

Living Water International exists to demonstrate the love of God by helping these communities acquire desperately needed clean water, and to experience "living water"—the gospel of Jesus Christ—which alone satisfies the deepest thirst.


