# **Pastor's Word**

### Kinsmen Connection, page 2

### Hello everyone!

Having been here for a few weeks now, I've had a chance to meet many of you and have some conversations in the courtyard after worship. Thanks for stopping and introducing yourself! I thought it might be helpful to share a little about intentional interim ministry and what you might expect. Transitions within pastoral leadership can bring a mix of emotions excitement, uncertainty, and even a sense of loss. On the other hand, this interim period is an opportunity for growth, renewal, and discernment.

Here are some key aspects of what you can anticipate during our time together:

### 1. Collaborative Worship and Spiritual Nourishment:

I am working hard to get up to speed on the suite of worship services here at Kinsmen and all that is required to put them together. I'll be sharing preaching and presiding duties with Pr. Beth, pretty much the same as Pr. Mark had done in the past. Please be patient with my missteps while I learn the specifics of the Kinsmen way on Sunday morning. Starting in July, I'll be teaching a Sunday school class called "Making Sense of Martin Luther" which you will be hearing more about soon.

### 2. Pastoral Care and Support:

As your interim associate pastor, I will be providing pastoral care and support as part of the team, but since I live about an hour away from our campus, certainly not as much as your future settled associate will be providing. However, please know that I am available for conversation and visitation. Your joys, concerns, and sorrows are all important to me. It is just that it might take a bit longer for me to respond.

### 3. Congregational Assessment and Reflection:

During this interim period, a key task will be for congregational self-reflection and assessment of what gifts and graces we need in our future settled associate pastor. There is a formal process that is used to develop a profile of the congregation and capture our aspirations for how the future settled pastor will help us in carrying out the vision, mission, and values of Kinsmen. Many of you have already given your input into this, so thank you! Your insights and perspectives are essential in this process, as the call committee works through the process.

I am excited and deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve as your interim associate pastor and to be part of the journey that lies ahead. Over the next few months, we have a wonderful opportunity to grow in love, deepen our faith, and continue to make a positive difference in our community. ### Sermon Series: Faith and Film



# Storytelling: To Reveal Our Values


### Making Sense of Martin Luther by David Lose Sundays at 9:45AM (July 9-August 20)

## **Community of Hope Training**

Do you want to grow in your relationship with Christ? Do you want to acquire the skills to handle different life situations in your everyday journey? Then, the Community of Hope is for you where you will be challenged in your relationship with Christ and utilize life skills to help others.



Community of Hope International is designed to create Christian communities of lay volunteer pastoral caregivers united in prayer, shaped by Benedictine Spirituality and equipped for and serving in pastoral care ministries. The volunteer Pastoral Caregivers

remain united in prayer and community as their ministries lead them to serve in the congregation and in the wider community. The program remains rooted in Benedictine Spirituality and is based on the classic "clinical pastoral education" model used in many hospitals to train pastoral caregivers.

The Community of Hope training awakens trainees to God's call on each of our lives by helping individuals discover and better understand their own spiritual gifts for ministry. Each participant is encouraged to make this experience a journey into wholeness to use this opportunity to explore a "rule of life", practice sacred silence, Christian meditation, compassionate listening, pastoral identity and Lectio Divina, all within the context of Benedictine Spirituality.

## LUTHERANISM AND THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY

In our congregation, most of the Hispanic community that has grown exponentially in recent years, comes from the Roman Catholic Church. However, many of them are seeking to renew their faith, to adapt to their new way of life in this country, and to meet their spiritual needs.

At the same time, the immigrant community faces great challenges from the cultural, economic, educational, social, language point of view, (among many others) and requires support through educational programs, accompaniment and help to lead them to become integral citizens, with all their rights and duties that positively contribute to their abilities.

In the Latino Kinsmen / Sagrada Familia we want to focus on making known, learning, and adopting Lutheranism as a way of life, so that parishioners really understand what being Lutheran is about and how to practice it.

First, Lutherans are catholics: Christ makes himself present in communion.

And we practice within our liturgy:

- the Bible Readings
- the intercessory Prayers
- Greeting of Peace
- Offerings
- Eucharistic Prayer
- Holy Communion

WE WORK ON THESE VALUES DURING OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATIONS AND IN ALL THE ACTIVITIES WE CARRY OUT TO MAKE LUTHERANISM A WAY OF LIFE FOR OUR HISPANIC COMMUNITY.

We are catholic Christians, members of the universal and apostolic church, one family in Christ, through Baptism. We work and pray for the unity of the entire church on earth, longing for that day when the Holy Spirit will be reunited with all Christians into one body, a people who will be one, just as Jesus and the Father are one.

According to Lutheran teaching, faith is not an intellectual acceptance of doctrines about God but is a dynamic transforming trust of the unconditional love of God, who justifies the wicked.

Through GRACE: living the Church as a family that has received the gift of forgiveness, reconciliation, and liberation.

Through FAITH: which springs from the trust and obedience that allows us to live in the family where we share the gifts of forgiveness and reconciliation.

In conclusion, our message is Salvation by God's grace through faith, and our contribution to the community.

Under these premises we are preparing to impart during the summer these teachings, as a prologue to the membership classes. As a tool we will use the material: Baptized We Live: Lutheranism as a way of life by Daniel Erlander, in its Spanish version, where he explains in a simple and concise way the most important aspects of being Lutheran.

We think that the greater knowledge of our doctrine is a fundamental part to stimulate the Latino community to membership, without forgetting its roots and cultural traditions to welcome an integrated and multicultural church, where the predominant values are the Faith, and the love of God and our brothers.



## **Report on Latino Ministry**

These are activities that have happened during the past month:



**FIRST COMMUNION:** On May 21, we celebrated the first communion of 9 young Hispanics. It was a very spiritual celebration and we had large attendance. At the end, we had a lunch with most of the families and their friends. We had great help from volunteers in organizing this event. Without them it would not have been possible. We thank them for their support. We also appreciate the assistance of Pastor Beth during communion and blessing each communicant.

HORIZON GRANT: One youth in the congregation received a Horizon grant from the

ELCA. The objective of this program is to support youth who do not have English as their first language and who are willing to work in the Church during the summer receiving a financial stipend from the ELCA. This program will continue until next August.

**ESL AND HUNGER GRANT:** On May 25, we concluded our ESL semester with a celebration of English and Spanish students. We will continue working on cultural integration, unfortunately one of the original teachers, Connie McMahon, is retiring from teaching, but we are so grateful to her and Charlie!

We thank all our volunteer teachers for their efforts and dedication. Classes resumes in August.

The grant for the financing of these educational programs came to an end this year. However we are in the process of applying for it to be renewed for a period of 3 years. We hope that these funds will be awarded to us to continue the ESL, as well as Financial Peace and Citizenship Classes.

**OPEN CAMP AT LUTHERHILL:** For the first time, a group from Latino Ministry visited Lutherhill. 42 people attended! They had a day full of entertainment and fun. This has been a great opportunity to show our parishioners the resources we have that are for the enjoyment of the community. We hope to continue organizing activities.



An incredible gift has been given to Kinsmen from the Estate of Barbara Phillips. Barbara died in September 2022. She wasn't officially a member, but when she was healthy, she was here every weekend. When she became ill, Kinsmen staff and lay chaplains visited her regularly. After her death, we were taken aback and surprised to learn that Kinsmen was the beneficiary

of her entire Estate. This gift will eventually be over \$550,000!

Her extraordinary generosity will be divided up and put toward the following purposes:

- Campus improvements determined by the Campus Management Team: \$192,500.00
- Endowment Fund where grants can be requested for specific projects: \$227,500.00

• "Green" projects that will save energy costs in the future: \$75,000.00

• Go into a reserve fund: \$55,000.00

This gift, with support from the Endowment Fund, has already made the Memorial Fountain and Plaza project possible.
