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
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Pastor's Word

Dearest Kinsmen/ Sagrada Familia Brothers and Sisters,

Have you ever been tested and tempted to lean in the opposite direction of love? Have you noticed that there is a weight and a heaviness that come with it? It's almost as though there is something keeping you from being free and truly living.

In Luke 10, we learn that Jesus was challenged and tested from time to time. One time, a lawyer tested Jesus and asked: "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" The lawyer answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as





Love God. Love Neighbor. This is how we truly live an abundant life. Maybe that's why Jesus said this command summed up all the law in the scripture. It's at the heart of what Jesus taught and that is why this commandment can be found in the 3 gospels of Mark, Matthew and Luke. We are to love God with everything we have. OK. Yes. But we're supposed to love our neighbors!?....as ourselves? Well, who are our neighbors? And what does it actually mean to love them in this day and age? Jesus gave many examples of who our neighbors are and how to show love to them through his teachings, healings, and interactions with the men and women he met. He also liked to tell parables or short powerful stories like the one about the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37).

The Samaritans were a group of people, in Jesus' day, who weren't liked very much. In the parable, not only does Jesus call the Samaritan good, but the Samaritan is the only one who helps and shows mercy to someone left on the side of the road. The parable of the Good Samaritan challenges us to widen our scope on who is our neighbor and widen our vision to see how to be a good neighbor. The sermon series beginning mid-September will explore the call to and art of neighboring. We will focus on this during worship. We will also gather in all kinds of new groups to be challenged and tempted to lean into love.

- 1. Sunday Morning Bible studies at 9:45AM
- 2. A New Men's evening Bible Study, in addition to the current Wednesday morning study
- 3. Women's Bible studies—First Tuesday of the month, and Thursday mornings

- 5. Groups gathering around a common interest, including Book Club, Euchre, Pickleball, Disc Golf and Board Games
- 6. An Intro to Kinsmen Class

- 1. The Art of Neighboring by Jay Pathak and Dave Runyon
- 2. The Abundant Community by John McKnight and Peter Block (This one really challenged me and helped me think about community in a whole new way.)

Don't wait to be invited. THIS is your invitation. I encourage you to grow in faith and hope this month by joining a group, reading a book, and being a good neighbor.


September 18 - October 23 (in person and online)








Every 3rd Thursday, 7PM beginning in September.


Discipleship Path

OUR EXPERIENCE IN KSU

This summer Pastor Gabriel and I were invited to participate in Kinsmen Summer University. Even though we accepted delightedly, this represented a challenge for us. We wondered: will it be a bilingual class? Can we transmit our knowledge effectively? Will the language

be a barrier? How will we make it interesting and fun? So, we set to work on the preparation of a floral arrangements class and



The floral arrangement class was attended by more than 20 people,

both from the Anglo and Latino community. P. Gabriel was able to explain the activities in both languages and we thought that people had a very pleasant time and returned home happy with their arrangements to decorate their homes. The last class was attended by a gentleman, which showed us that art is an activity for everyone.

Personally, I took a long time to choose which piece would be chosen to paint in watercolor. On the one hand, it should be suitable for beginners—beautiful, and able to be completed in two classes. On the other hand, watercolor requires a certain technique, and it was also necessary to explain and practice the basic principles.

My class was 100% English speakers. I made a script with all the necessary information, however I was a little worried whether everyone understood my explanations with my Spanish accent. But it was an incredible experience we all enjoyed. We had a relaxing time focused on painting and the results left me pleasantly surprised.
