# **Pastor's Word**

Kinsmen Connection, page 2

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In Matthew 16, Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answers "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus replies saying it is that confession upon which the church will be built. Jesus didn't literally mean Peter the person and he didn't literally mean a church built with stones. Instead, he meant that a community of believers, beginning with Peter, would be formed with all making that same confession: Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the LIVING God.

That means that, just like Peter's public confession, we, as the church, are to publicly confess/ state our belief about our living God. Each one of us at every age and at all is to proclaim and publicly confess who God in Jesus is. So I'd like for us to try something as a congregation at the beginning of September:

First, I encourage you to make a cardboard sign or poster with some kind of confession that God is living among us today. It can say something simple like "God is love" or "God forgives" or "Jesus cares for those who feel lost and alone" or be creative......what is your confession of faith about our living God today? Begin with "God/ Jesus is"...then fill in the blank.

Second, go to a public place that you believe symbolizes hope in our community. Where do you see our living God active in our community? With a coach or referee? In a classroom? In a volunteer group? At work? In a park? Wherever it is, take a picture of yourself holding your sign and send it to <u>office@kinsmenlutheran.org</u>.

Third, on September 9-10, we'll feature some of the photos you send to us in worship. At that worship service, we will pray that God might transform our signs and our confessions into a living faith that knows no barriers or boundaries.

Finally, on September 11, a day that has come to have great significance in our country, we'll post these messages of good news on social media. That is a day we all need to be reminded of God's living good news today.

During the rest of September and October, we'll be reminded of the strange ways of God—the ways of forgiving, welcoming, and restoring relationships. Join us and invite a friend to this 7-week sermon series where we'll explore God's strange ways and how they lead us to life.

### An Overview of the Old Testament

### Sundays at 9:45AM beginning September 10 in Conference Room

Amy-Jill Levine is one of the most respected NT scholars of our time. In this course, however, we will be tapping into her

extensive knowledge of the Hebrew bible (or Tanakh), which is our Old Testament. We cannot lose sight of the fact that, when Jesus referred to scripture (e.g., Matthew 4:4, Luke 4:21), he was referring to the Old Testament, which had been translated from Hebrew to Greek circa 250 BCE. This version is called the Septuagint.

The Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) is a three-year cycle of weekly readings ("lections") used to varying degrees by the vast majority of mainline Protestant churches in Canada and the United States. There are usually four readings for each Sunday-one from the Old Testament, the Psalter, the Epistles, and the Gospels.

Every weekend at Kinsmen, two of the readings assigned for a particular Sunday are read aloud. The purpose of this study group is to focus first on those two readings for the upcoming worship service and, if time is available, the other readings as well. 

### **Exploring Alternatives to Division** Wednesdays at 6:00 PM (Sept 6-27)

Do you have a friend or family member with whom you often have disagreements?

Have you wondered how you might be a bridge to divisions?

Beginning in September we will have a 4-week experience that will help you "Explore Alternatives to Division." The first class will introduce the concept of storytelling as a tool to reveal your own personal values. The following week each class member will take an inventory called the Intercultural Development Inventory. A group report will be given in the second class and life applications and practices will be a part of Units 3-6. The units are interconnected and flow from personal engagement toward engaging in the public arena. Attendance at all units is strongly encouraged. The method of instruction/discussion will use both Zoom and in person interactions. (See the schedule below.) Also, due to the nature of this class, it will be limited to 15 people.

The facilitator of this class will be the Rev. Dr. Nancy Maeker (Pastor Beth's mother). She is a retired ELCA pastor who has served in congregations, on a synod staff, and as an executive director of a non-profit. She's also a Qualified Administrator of the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI). In her current vocation she is working to break down walls that divide people from one another—politically, socially, religiously. No books are needed. However, there is a charge of \$25 to take the Inventory. This can be paid online or in person.





### **Mental Health Matters**

### September 20 from 6:30-8 PM

According to the Anxiety and Depression Association of America, although mental illnesses are more prevalent in women than in men, men suffering from mental illnesses are less likely to receive mental health treatment or diagnosis. There are many reasons for this and one of them is the pressure men face to "man up" or "tough it out." The stigma of men speaking out is that it is seen as a form of weakness or not "manly."

Men, feeling depression and anxiety or any other mental health illness is



not unusual and is nothing to feel ashamed of. Other reasons that may impact a man's mental health journey are culture, fatherhood, race, and socioeconomic status. These stigmas are real and deeply affect men as nearly 1 in 10 men experience depression or anxiety but less than half will receive treatment and more than 4 times as many men as women die by suicide every year.

Join the Mental Health Matters initiative on September 20 from 6:30-8 PM (in the sanctuary) as we sit down with three men - Billy Pickett, Dan Hornstein, & Derek LaHair - as they discuss some of the issues they've faced in their lives, seeking help, and what they do to maintain their mental well-being.

# From immigration to Citizenship...a long way

Immigrating to a new country is a complicated process for people and even more so when it comes to a family. Sometimes we migrate in search of new opportunities, but other times it is the alternative to the critical political or economic situations of a country, or even both.

Moving to a new country means losing many things: family, friends, home, our tastes, our smells, our land, but at the same time many opportunities are gained if we do things well and if we work for them.

After arriving in the United States, one of the biggest goals is to become an American citizen. It is the last step to adopt the country and for the country to adopt us. But becoming a citizen is not an easy task, not only because we must prove that we deserve it by our behavior, but we must also pass many requirements.

The first difficult step is the citizenship test; an oral and written test where knowledge of government, civics, history and geography are examined. In addition to being able to write and speak in English, 100 questions must be studied, of which 10 will be asked, and at least 6 must be answered correctly orally.

To prepare the people who will take the citizenship test we have implemented the program of classes at Kinsmen, taught by Luis Mata, a young volunteer who donates time and knowledge to help prepare for the exam. We must also highlight the support of the Barbara Bush Library and Gery Marquez, who has provided us with training and valuable materials.

Finally, an interview is carried out with the immigration officer who is the one who approves the citizenship applications. This is the most difficult part of the process. Since you are in a stressful situation, you cannot memorize your answers and questions can range from data on your application to how the weather is that day.

Assertiveness and body language are also considered. If any aspect of your application is considered important to the officer, the officer may ask for an explanation or more detailed documentation.

To be successful in this last step, participants of the citizenship course will be trained in the use of the vocabulary commonly used during the interview and (even more importantly) will be subjected to a mock interview to familiarize them with the process.

Although no course can guarantee citizenship, we believe this class is an important contribution to the Latino population and encourages us to continue working to provide programs of this type to help improve the living conditions in our community.
