

Projects Made Possible by Gifts to the Kinsmen Endowment Fund

September 2020:

- \$1,000 to Northwest Assistance Ministries
- In response to the COVID-19 crisis and natural disaster related impacts to our community, this gift was made to support basic needs through Northwest Assistance Ministries (NAM).





December 2019:

• \$2,000 allocated to courtyard beautification for the Christmas Season

September 2019:

- \$2,456 provided 2 performances as part of the Abendmusik program.
- The beloved children's story, "The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe," was performed by the A.D. Players at Kinsmen and was open to the public during the holiday season. A second performance was made possible with this gift via a virtual presentation of Apollo to the Moon, also performed by the A.D. Players.

July 2019:

- \$2,500 provided Walking the Mourner's Path training to launch a new ministry at Kinsmen.
- Kinsmen now has 2 Lay Chaplains to minister those facing grief from the loss of a loved one



January 2019:

- \$3,940 provided conference tables and chairs for the Kinsmen library.
- This project provides a highly needed mid-sized meeting space for Kinsmen Members and the community.







November 2018: \$4,000 completes a turf project to ensure KCA kids can enjoy God's creation as soon as the weather clears.

November 2018:

- \$2,709.02 allocated to replace the broken water fountain in the KCA area.
- Installation Pending.



August 2017: 3 Projects Funded

- \$1,025.00: Commemorative Pens and meal tickets for Special Guests at Kinsmen's 45th Anniversary Celebration
- \$3,636.75: New A/V Equipment was needed for the Sanctuary. When a special discount became available to round-out the project, the Endowment Grant funded an LCD projector to take advantage of a discount and complete the project.
- \$1,685.00: Video Ministry Team Start-Up Equipment. This allocation fully funded this project.
