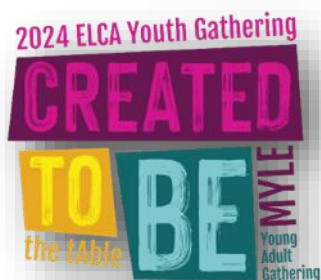
Pastor's Word

Worshipping in the Super Dome with tens of thousands of Lutherans just like me was a seminal moment in my formation as a Christian. I'm so very excited to accompany this group as they experience the gathering and see what the Holy Spirit might stir up within them.

Double Installation Service April 14 at 3PM

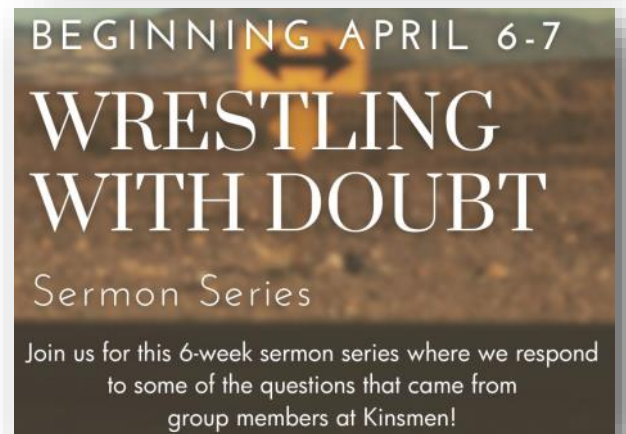

Wrestling with Doubt Beginning April 6-7

There's a great story in book of Genesis about Jacob's wrestling match with God. It's found in chapter 32 and as he wrestled, he was both humbled and blessed. His hip was put out of joint and this humbled him so that God could finally bless him and use him for God's purposes. Asking questions about our faith is one way we wrestle with God. In doing this, we confess that we don't know everything and we become more open to hearing God. God has great plans for us, but we might need to be humbled a bit, listen to God, and wrestle with God before we can be used by God to be a blessing.

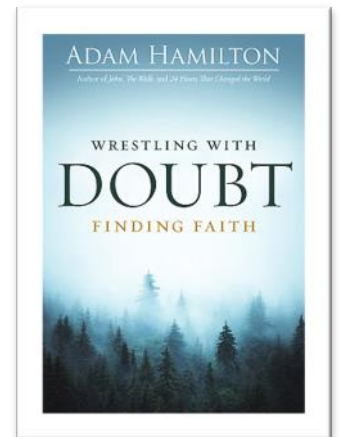
Wrestling with Doubt

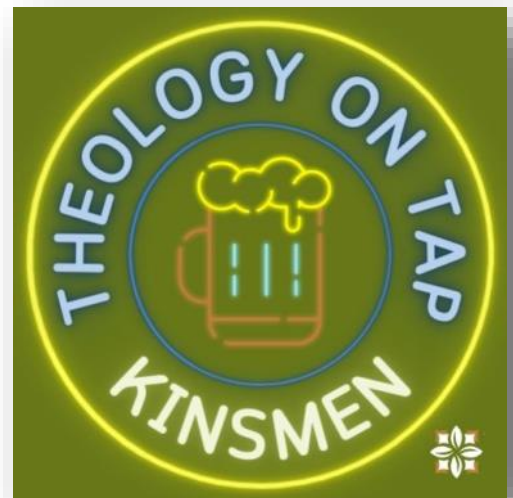


Young Adult Ministry

Noisy Offering—Redeemed Ministries

April 13-14

Redeemed Ministries is a Christ-centered ministry serving survivors of sex trafficking in the Houston area. The first safe house to open for survivors in 2010 and one of the first in the entire country, Redeemed has served survivors with excellence. Our mission is to serve domestic survivors



of commercial sexual exploitation with a trauma-informed approach and a holistic program. We offer our services totally free of charge and work with both residential clients and independent clients. Our residential clients are able to spend up to two years in our safe house. While in the program they receive wrap-around services that include case management, counseling, life skills classes, sobriety management, and a variety of other support services. Residents participate in education classes and therapeutic activities such as counseling and equine therapy during the week and enjoy relaxed time off over the weekend and in the evenings.

The women we work with suffer from Complex PTSD and are recovering from extreme sexual trauma. We work with them to reduce symptoms, heal from the trauma, and prepare to integrate into society as functioning members of their local communities. While in our program residents are able to participate in the Redeemed Economic Empowerment Program (REEP), which enables them to begin earning an income with dignity in a safe environment. They are able to learn the basics of being a retainable employee, how to manage triggers in the workplace, how to manage a budget, and so much more. They attend financial literacy classes, work with a financial advisor, and begin saving money for independent living. Residents are able to begin working outside the safe house after spending one full year in the program, and in 18 months we will help them purchase a reliable vehicle!

Having sustainable income and a reliable vehicle eliminates two vulnerabilities traffickers often use to lure victims. Once women complete 2 full years in the program they are eligible to participate in our Graduate Housing Program, thereby eliminating the vulnerability of lacking safe housing. Our goal is to provide sustainable resources for the women we work with to decrease recidivism. In fact, we've discovered when a resident successfully completes our program and maintains consistent contact with us, they have a much lower chance of relapsing than those who choose not to complete the program or those who try to get out all on their own.

Another focus of our organization is to equip our staff and volunteers with knowledge. We value training and make sure our team is well-trained and prepared to work with our clients. Our Executive Director, Bobbie Mark serves as adjunct faculty with The Institute For Shelter Care, a national organization that trains newer organizations who are preparing to open residential care homes.

We love raising awareness in our community and training new volunteers to serve alongside us. We would love getting you plugged into our annual Golf For Good golf tournament and our annual gala. In the month of April, you will be learning more about a new Kinsmen mission partner, Redeemed. Please refer to the article on page 13. Redeemed has a safe house for the women they serve, but they had to give up separate office space some months back due to financial constraints.



Ideally, there should be a separation between the residence and office space for these recovering victims. The ladies thrive more when they have a routine that includes leaving their home to go "work/learn" and then return home to unwind and do chores. They are working hard to maintain a work/school focus as Redeemed has had to work out of the safe house, but things would be greatly improved with an office space.

Redeemed is seeking office space with little or no rent which they can utilize long term. The ideal space would have:

- Private or secluded location in north/east Spring area, ideally (not 1960 - too busy and unsafe)
- 6 private offices
- 2 open areas for classes and support groups
- storage areas
- 2 bathrooms
- kitchen or kitchenette

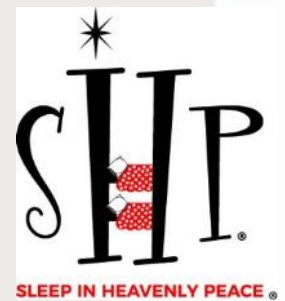

Call for Project Proposals from Endowment Fund Allocations!

The Kinsmen Generosity Team recently approved 2 Endowment Grant applications. One was for new chairs and a rug for Pastor Jay's office. The other was for an X-Scrub Floor Cleaner requested by the Custodians.

The Team continues to accept proposal requests to fund ministries and special projects apart from the Kinsmen Lutheran Church's annual budget from the Kinsmen Endowment Fund. These ministries and projects may be internal to Kinsmen, supporting our surrounding community, or of national & global outreach, but must be connected in some way to the values, vision, and purpose of Kinsmen Lutheran Church.

Projects to be considered would typically fall within the \$1,000 - \$5,000 range, but other amounts may be possible. A completion of a grant application is not guaranteed to be fully or partially funded. Please complete and return the Kinsmen Endowment Fund Grant Application Form by October 1st for consideration in 2024 to Pastor Beth Warpmaeker.
